The framework is organised around three core capacities, each underpinned by complementary attributes. These attributes are expressed through practical skills, behaviours, and mindsets that students develop during their studies and beyond.

1. We support students to actively engage with their learning and apply it confidently in diverse contexts:

Industry-Specific Knowledge

The depth of understanding required to excel in a chosen field, grounded in current theory and professional practice.

Practical Skills

The hands-on competencies and technical abilities to perform effectively in professional settings.

Enterprise and Entrepreneurial Thinking

The mindset to identify opportunities, take measured risks, innovate ethically, and create sustainable value.

2. We equip students to navigate complexity, uncertainty, and change with confidence and resilience:

Critical Thinking

The capacity to analyse information rigorously, challenge assumptions, and develop innovative solutions.

Resilience

The determination to overcome setbacks, maintain wellbeing, and persevere through challenges.

Adaptability

The flexibility to respond positively to changing circumstances and embrace new ideas and technologies.

3. We foster the personal qualities and future-ready skills essential for lifelong learning and success:

Strong Communication

The ability to express ideas clearly and persuasively across different media and audiences.

Confidence

The self-belief to take initiative, lead, and engage constructively with feedback.

Proactive Learning
