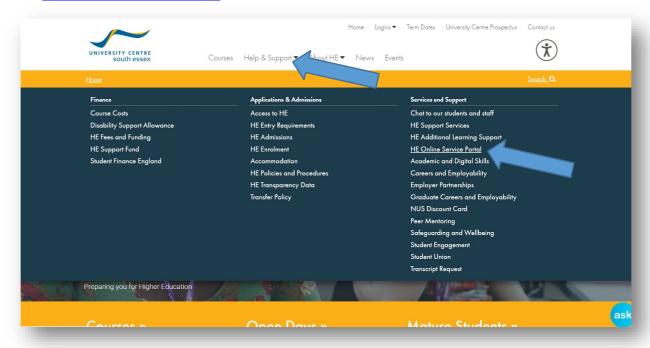

How to log into the Online Services Portal

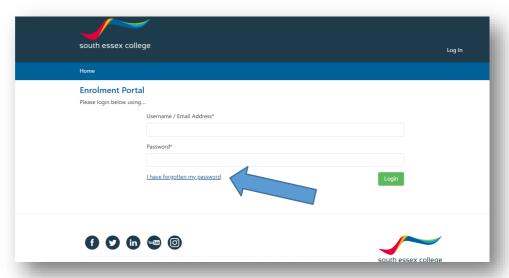
Go to the <u>HE page</u> on the college website and click Help and Support. From the drop down menu choose HE Online Service Portal



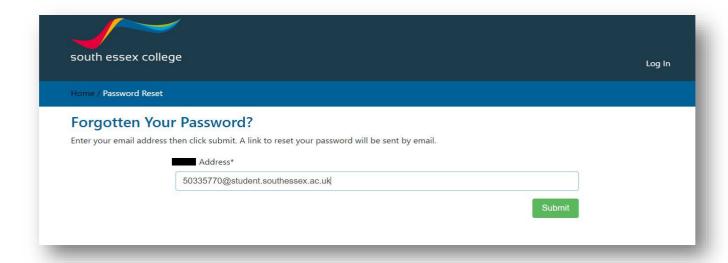
This will open the HE Online Services Portal page. To open the portal click on the link under "Access from anywhere"



This will take you to the HE Online Services Portal. If you have already complete registration enter your student email address and password. If you have not signed in previously, or cannot remember your password, click "I have forgotten my password".



Enter your student email address and click 'Submit'.



You will then see the below. If you receive a different message please contact us.



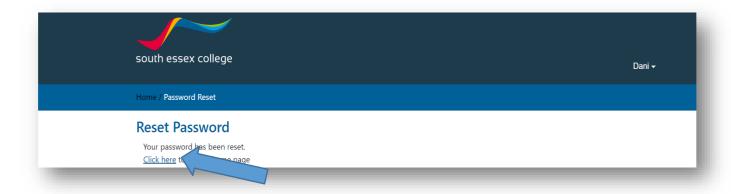
You will then receive an email to your student e-mail account to reset your password, please note this make take up to three hours to arrive. Click the link provided to reset your password.



Enter your date of birth and create a New Password. Then click 'Submit'.

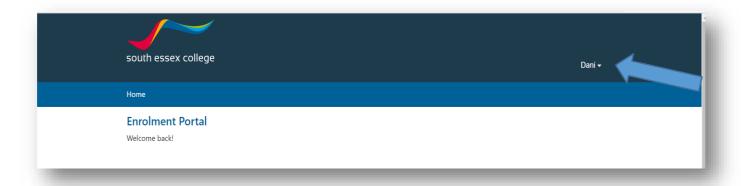


Once it has confirmed your password reset, click "Click here" to be brought to your home page.

Click your name on the righthand side of the home page.



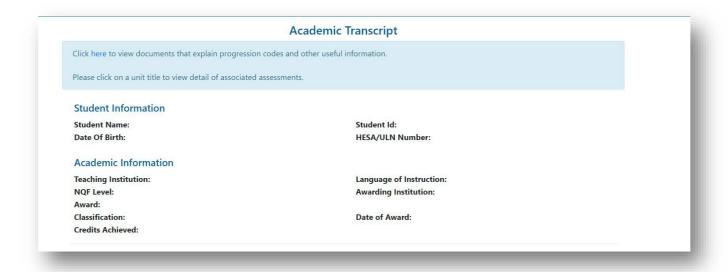
This will give a drop down list, choose "My Transcript".

Award: Your qualification title, e.g. BA (Hons) Graphic Design

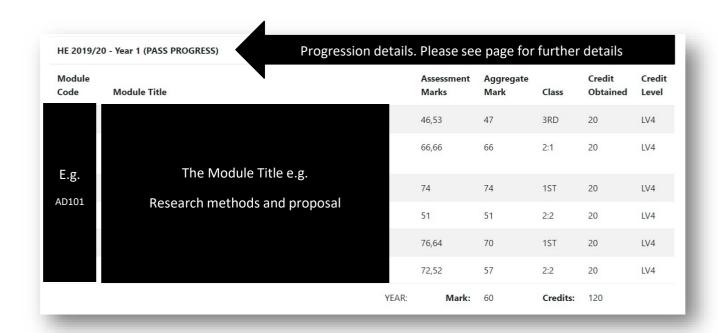
Progressing students, or those requiring Resits, will not have any details included in Classification, Credits Awarded or Date of Award. These fields are only filled on completion of your qualification.

Classification: Your classification of your overall qualification, e.g. 2.1 or Merit

Date of Award: Year you completed your qualification

Credits Achieved: The number of credits achieved for your overall qualification

The details included may be by a different name than you are used to as each Awarding Body has its own terminology.



Assessment Marks Marks given for each assessment in the module/unit

Aggregate Mark Overall outcome for the module/unit

Classification of the module/unit

Credit Obtained The number of credits awarded to the module/unit

Credit Level The level of study e.g. Level 4 (Year 1), Level 5 (Year 2) this varies

depending on the qualification

Year Mark Overall mark for the year

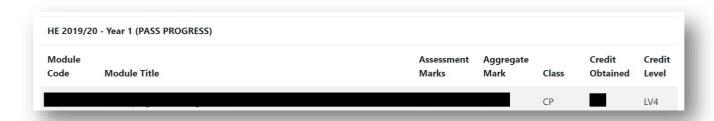
Year Credits The number of credits obtained for the year

University of East Anglia: CP - Compensated Pass. Where compensation is awarded by the Exam Board in a failed module. This means you can progress on your course or graduate even though you have not passed the module. The failing module is 'compensated' for if you have achieved good marks in all your modules except for one or two and is at the discretion of the board in line with UEA policy.

The below are the different types of progression information.

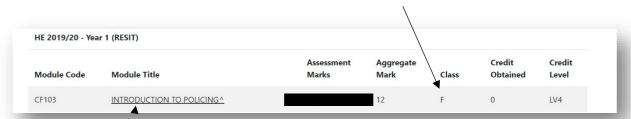
Pass Progress: You have progressed to the next year of the programme.



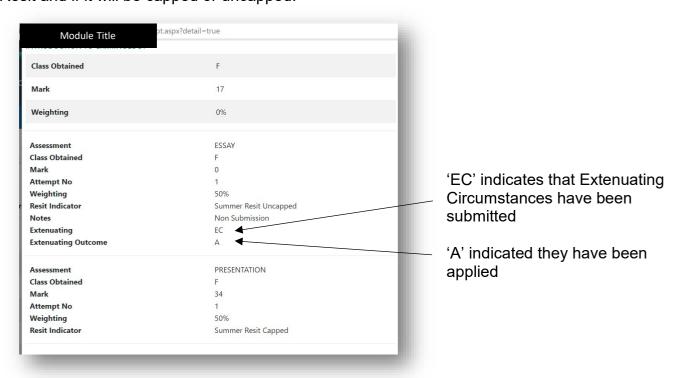
Resit: You are required to Resit some assessment to complete to progress to the next year of the programme. Contact your Tutor for further details regarding your assessments.

You can find details regarding your resits on looking at 'Class'. F indicates a failed module.



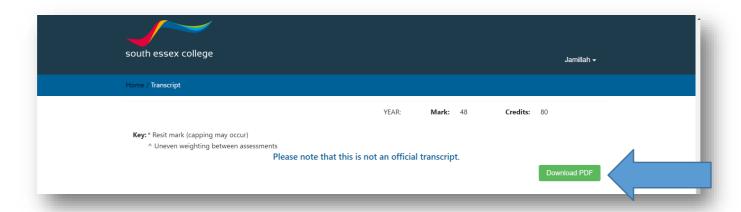
Click on the Module Title e.g. Introduction to Policing, to open a pop up with more details. This will vary depending on awarding body. This will indicate which assessments of the module require a Resit and if it will be capped or uncapped.



Downloading Your Transcript

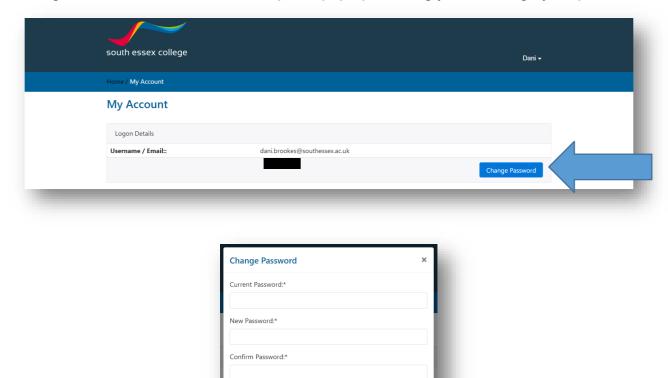

*Please note that this is not an official transcript and may not be recognised by employers or future institutions of study.



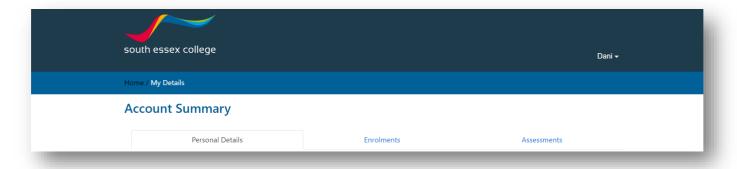
My Account

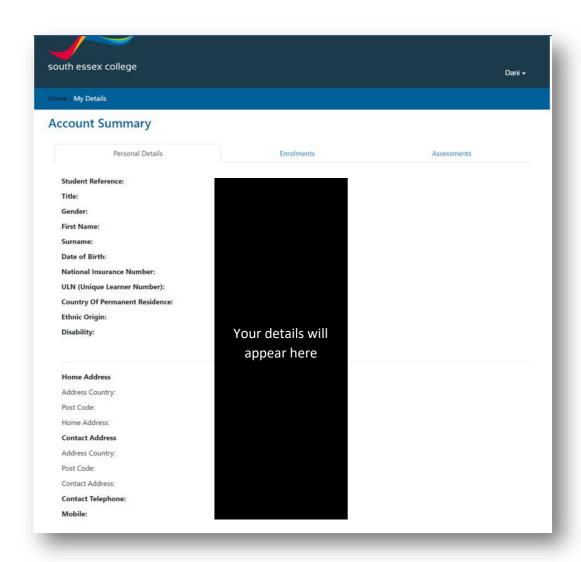
My Details - Account Summary

When you choose "My Details" from the dropdown list, on your name, this will show your Account Summary connected to your account. This includes Personal Details, Enrolment and Assessments.



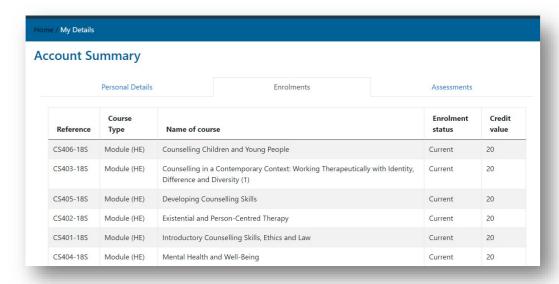
Personal Details

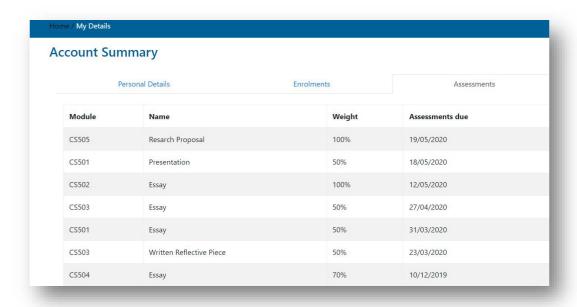
Enrolments

This page lists the Modules you are enrolled on, including details such as the Module Number, Title and Credit value.



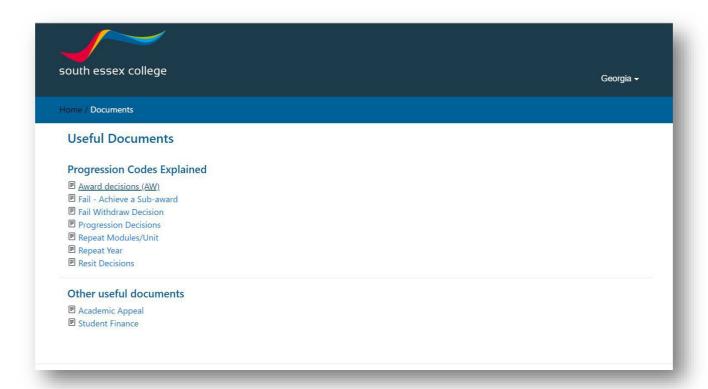
Assessments
