### 1. Preliminary items

## 2. College Self-Assessment Report 2020-21

The Chair of the Curriculum and Quality Committee summarised the key discussion points and actions from the earlier validation meeting. A range of suggestions had been made to improve future reports:

- Clear examples of evidence to substantiate judgements and an evaluative narrative that supports how judgements were made.
- Greater use of visuals as well as data.
- General rule of thumb to write for an audience that is not familiar with the subject matter.
- Inclusion of an executive summary.

The need to review the quality cycle, and to ensure that it synched with governance oversight and input, was also agreed.

With these provisos, governors supported the evaluation of strengths and weaknesses and the proposed grades.

#### AGREED:

- i) Review quality cycle and CQC meeting cycle to ensure that they link up properly.
- ii) Tighten up SAR process to start earlier and bring to governors earlier in the Autumn Term
- iii) QIP to be agreed at same time as SAR, and be informed by the SAR

RESOLVED: That the Self-Assessment Report 2020-21 and the proposed grade judgements be APPROVED.
