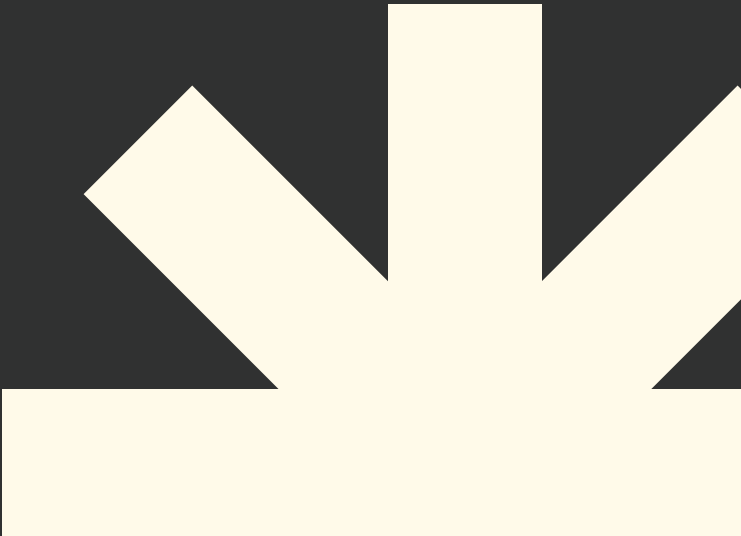

## Can I transfer from another University?

If you have already started a higher education course at another college or university and wish to transfer, we are happy to consider your application on the basis of qualifications obtained elsewhere. The college works within the guidelines of the structures of the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS).

## Access to Higher Education Diplomas

## Exceptional Entry

In the first instance we suggest you email [HEAdmissions@southessex.ac.uk](mailto:HEAdmissions@southessex.ac.uk) to discuss your application. You may need to demonstrate by interview, exceptional entry portfolio (this is likely to include evidence of paid or unpaid work experience) and/or written assessment that you are suitable for the course.

## Portfolio requirements

For some courses you may be required to show a portfolio/showreel that demonstrates a high level of visual skill, creativity, commitment, and self-motivation. You may need to show that you are capable of applying original thought to any given problem and that you have a high level of independent thinking. You may also be required to demonstrate evidence of any theoretical studies and examples of written work may be asked for. Each course that requires a portfolio or showreel at interview will have specific requirements.

## DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service)

Your chosen course and any associated placements may require you to undergo an enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check. Course pages will clearly indicate whether a DBS check is required and provide further information. DBS identification documents are verified by trained staff in line with DBS guidelines as part of the admissions process.

There may be an administration charge for this service and you will be advised of this once you apply.

### Important:

If you have lived outside the UK, you may also need to provide a criminal record check, certificate of good conduct, or equivalent documentation from the country or countries where you have resided. These overseas checks may be required in addition to any UK DBS check and are used to meet professional, regulatory and safeguarding requirements.

If you are unsure what documentation you need to provide, our Admissions team will be able to advise you.

## Step 2: Choose How to Apply

The application process depends on the course you're applying for:

**For Degree (BSc, BA, FdA and FdSc) programmes:**

If you are applying only to University Centre South Essex, you can apply directly via our online application system.

If you are applying to other universities as well, you'll need to apply through UCAS.

**For HTQs, HNDs, HNCs, CertEds, PGCEs, Level 4 & 5 Diplomas, and Part time courses:**

You will need to apply directly via our online application system.

Please ensure that all sections of your application are fully completed and include as much relevant information as possible. This helps us gain a clear understanding of your interests and experience when reviewing your application. Each application is considered individually and with care.

## Step 3: Submit Your Application

Depending on the course, you may be invited to attend an informal interview - either in person or online - to showcase your portfolio.

If you are applying for a PGCE, CertEd, or any education-related qualification, you will be invited in before the end of the Spring Term to complete a DBS check.

## Step 4: Receive Your Offer

Based on your application, you will receive either a conditional or unconditional offer. This depends on whether you have already met the entry criteria or are awaiting results.

## Step 5: Enrolment

We'll send out enrolment details in early summer for courses starting in September. You'll also receive helpful information to support your transition into university life. We can't wait for you to become part of our UCSE community!

The BA (Hons) Graphic Design & Illustration degree course treats the various subject areas within design not as discrete disciplines but as interweaving lines of enquiry. It is for this reason we operate upon a unit structure which encourages individual creativity.

The Level 4 HNC Leadership and Management aims to develop students' leadership and management skills and to provide knowledge and understanding to achieve high performance in the business environment. It provides insight into business operations and the opportunities and challenges presented by a global marketplace so that students can create and deliver operational plans that achieve goals and objectives. The Level 4 HNC provides the core skills required for a range of careers in leadership and management, including operations management, talent management, marketing, and sales and can lead to further study at Level 5 HND Leadership and Management.

The Level 5 HND Leadership and Management gives students the opportunity to gain knowledge, skills and behaviours aligned to the Occupational Standard (OS) for Operations Manager.

The units will prepare students to enter employment with the qualities and abilities necessary for roles that require personal responsibility and decision-making, and support students to aspire to future management roles. Students will have a sound understanding of the principles of leadership and management and will know how to apply those principles more widely in the business world. They will also be equipped to progress to Level 6 higher education study.

The BSc (Hons) Accounting and Finance Degree provides a rigorous academic curriculum, which offers students the opportunity to study the fundamental disciplines of accounting and finance and appreciate their context in the business, economic and social environments.

The course develops knowledge, skills and understanding in the key accounting disciplines of Financial Reporting, Management Accounting, Finance, Taxation, Audit and Governance within the accounting sector. It provides a conceptual foundation for professional careers in management or business, developing commercial awareness, critical and analytical thinking and the problem-solving skills required in a rapidly changing business environment. The course enables students, to enhance their employability opportunities and/or gain admission to a Master's programme or study for a professional qualification.

The main accountancy disciplines are supported by the embedding of the contextual framework, academic skills and practical skills within the programme.

These include Economics, Numeracy, Quantitative Methods, Business Law, Company Law, Ethics, Management Theory and Human Resource Management. In addition, the progressive development of cognitive and generic skills are embedded across the whole programme.

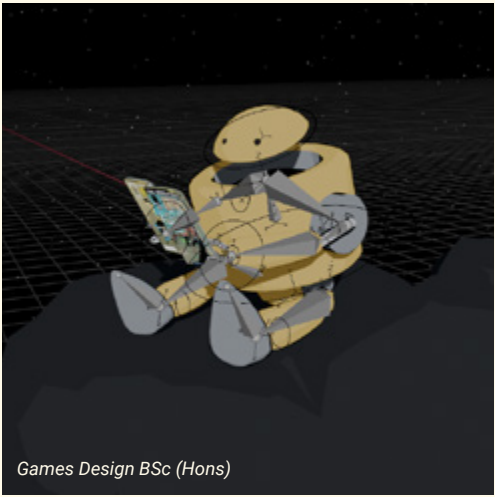

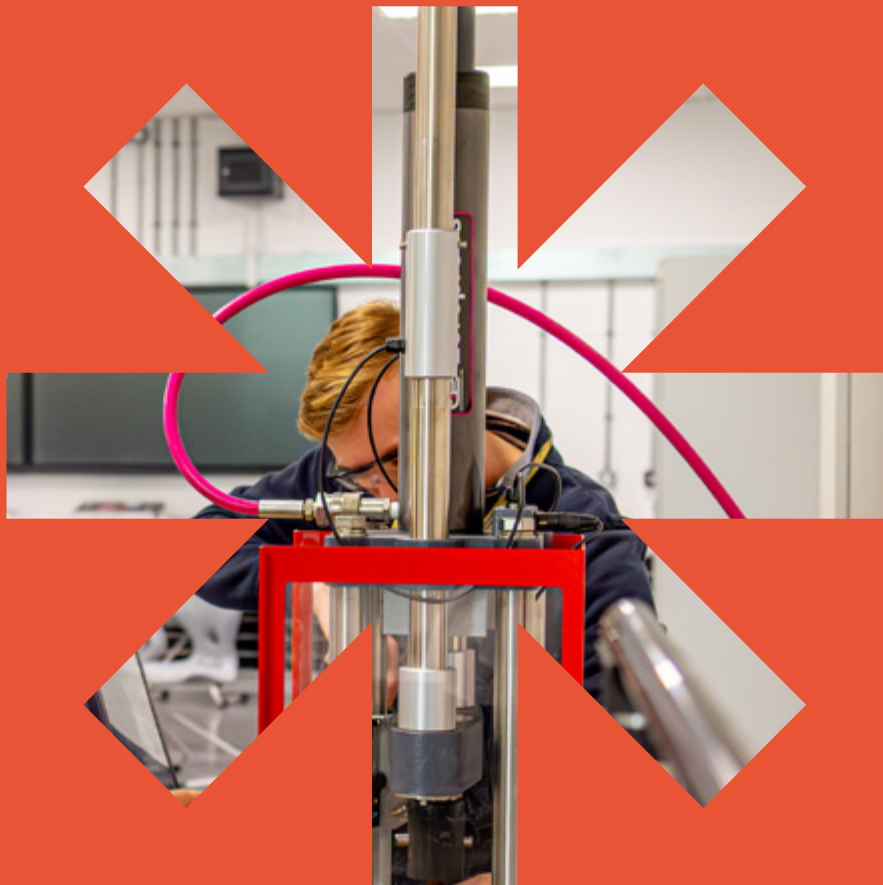

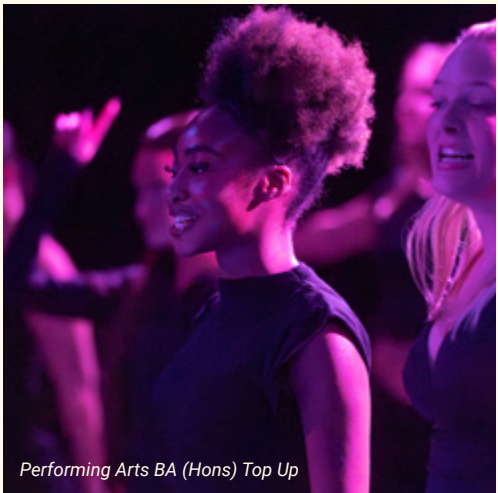

Psychology shapes everything that we do, as well as the world around us; it is therefore a vital discipline across many professional contexts. The fundamental aim of the BSc (Hons) Applied Psychology programme is to provide students with the knowledge and skills required to pursue careers in psychology-related disciplines such as healthcare, education, sport, and forensics.

This programme focuses on three core disciplinary strands of psychology, employability, and research methods. You must secure a suitable teaching placement. Whilst the ITE team will give advice on how to apply for positions we do not provide you with teaching placement. It is the responsibility of the prospective trainee to arrange their own placement.

The BA (Hons) Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND) Studies degree provides you with the theoretical and legislative skills that allow you to work in a variety of educational and care settings supporting those with specific needs (including learning disabilities, physical disabilities and mental health issues). The programme includes a work placement which will enable you to apply what is learnt in the classroom to the workplace environment and vice versa.

Entry Requirements:

A minimum of 64 UCAS points from one or more of the following:

- Access to Higher Education Diploma
- A Levels
- T Levels
- Extended Diploma
- Foundation Diploma in Art and Design (Level 3 or 4)
- Or equivalent EU/International qualifications, such as International Baccalaureate Diploma

# Access to HE courses

**We offer Access to Higher Education courses designed to prepare adults for university.**

These courses are ideal if you have been out of education for a while or need qualifications to progress to university. They help build the knowledge and skills you need to succeed in higher education. Most students are eligible for an Advanced Learner Loan.

## On-Campus Courses:

### Access to Higher Education Art and Design

#### Level 3 Diploma

**Campus: Southend**

#### Why should I do this course?

This course is for those who would like to progress to a higher education course in a wide variety of art and design degree courses such as the Fine Art BA (Hons) but need to gain the required entry qualifications and skills.

### Access to Higher Education Science

#### Level 3 Diploma

**Campus: Southend or Thurrock**

#### Why should I do this course?

This course is for those who would like to progress to higher education courses in science such as physiotherapy, radiography or dietetics degrees.

### Access to Higher Education Nursing and Midwifery\*

#### Level 3 Diploma

**Campus: Southend or Thurrock**

#### Why should I do this course?

This course is for those who would like to progress to a higher education course in nursing, midwifery or other health-related subject, but need to gain the required entry qualifications and skills.

# FAQs – Admissions

## How does UCSE feel about vocational courses?

Most of our courses have a strong vocational element and applications from students taking certain vocational qualifications are welcomed. Students who have a mixed portfolio of qualifications (BTEC National Award/Certificate and A Levels) are also welcomed.

## Does UCSE use unit grades in the admission process?

We do not use unit grades as standard procedure; however unit grade information may be used on receipt of examination results for individual applicants who do not meet the conditions of their offer.

## Will UCSE accept A level General Studies and A level Critical Thinking?

Yes. All of our departments accept either A Level General Studies or A Level Critical Thinking, as these awards require you to demonstrate a range of skills and knowledge.

## Are Maths/English qualifications required for a degree?

English is required for all courses. Applicants to UAL and UEA validated programmes are ideally expected to hold GCSE English and Maths at Grade 4 or above (or equivalent). If you do not meet these requirements, our Admissions Team can advise on the options available to you.

## What qualifications do I need if English is not my first language?

If English is not your first language, you will need to demonstrate an appropriate level of English language proficiency to study on your chosen course. We accept a range of recognised English language qualifications and tests. English language requirements may vary by course, so please refer to the relevant course page or visit our entry requirements webpage for the latest information.

If you are unsure whether your qualifications meet our requirements, please contact our Admissions team for advice.

## Do any courses require additional aptitude tests?

We will not ask you to take any of the existing aptitude tests (e.g. LNAT) as a pre-requisite for admission. We believe that the existing system for assessing applicants provides enough information to make informed decisions.

## Does UCSE accept the Extended Project?

## What else will be taken into account when making offers?

- GCSE performance, including possession of prerequisites (e.g. Maths and/or English at Grade 4)
- AS-levels, including subject mix and declared results
- Maths/English Grade 4 (new specification)
- A Level or equivalent qualifications, including subject mix, need for prerequisites, and predicted grades
- Your UCAS personal statement responses, including your motivation for choosing the course, how your qualifications and studies have prepared you, and any relevant experience or activities outside education. We will also consider the skills and qualities you demonstrate, including critical thinking, analytical skills, problem-solving and communication skills
- Enrichment and extra-curricular activity, including work experience, qualifications (e.g. Duke of Edinburgh, Young Enterprise), positions of responsibility held, evidence of non-academic achievements and engagement in relevant cultural and social activities, as outlined in your UCAS application response
- Reference from school or college
- Interview/audition performance (if required)
- Portfolio evidence (if required)
- Any relevant mitigating circumstances which have a bearing upon your application



# Fees & Funding

**Our aim is to support you from application through to your graduation and beyond with the highest quality information, advice and guidance.**

## Do I have to pay anything up-front?

No, you don't have to pay anything before you start your studies. Student loans are available to UK national or Irish citizens settled under the EU settlement scheme or granted settled status for other reasons to cover tuition fees.

## Am I eligible for a tuition fee loan?

Your eligibility for student finance depends on your individual circumstances, including your course, previous study and residency status.

## Does household income affect me getting a tuition fee loan?

No, tuition fee loans are not based on household income. As long as you are eligible to apply, you will receive the full tuition fee amount.

## Lifelong Learning Entitlement

For eligible courses starting in September 2027, student finance applications through the Lifelong Learning Entitlement (LLE) are expected to open in spring 2027.

The LLE is the new student finance system for most higher education courses starting from 2027 and may provide support towards tuition fees and living costs, depending on your eligibility.

You do not need to wait until you have a confirmed course offer before applying for student finance.

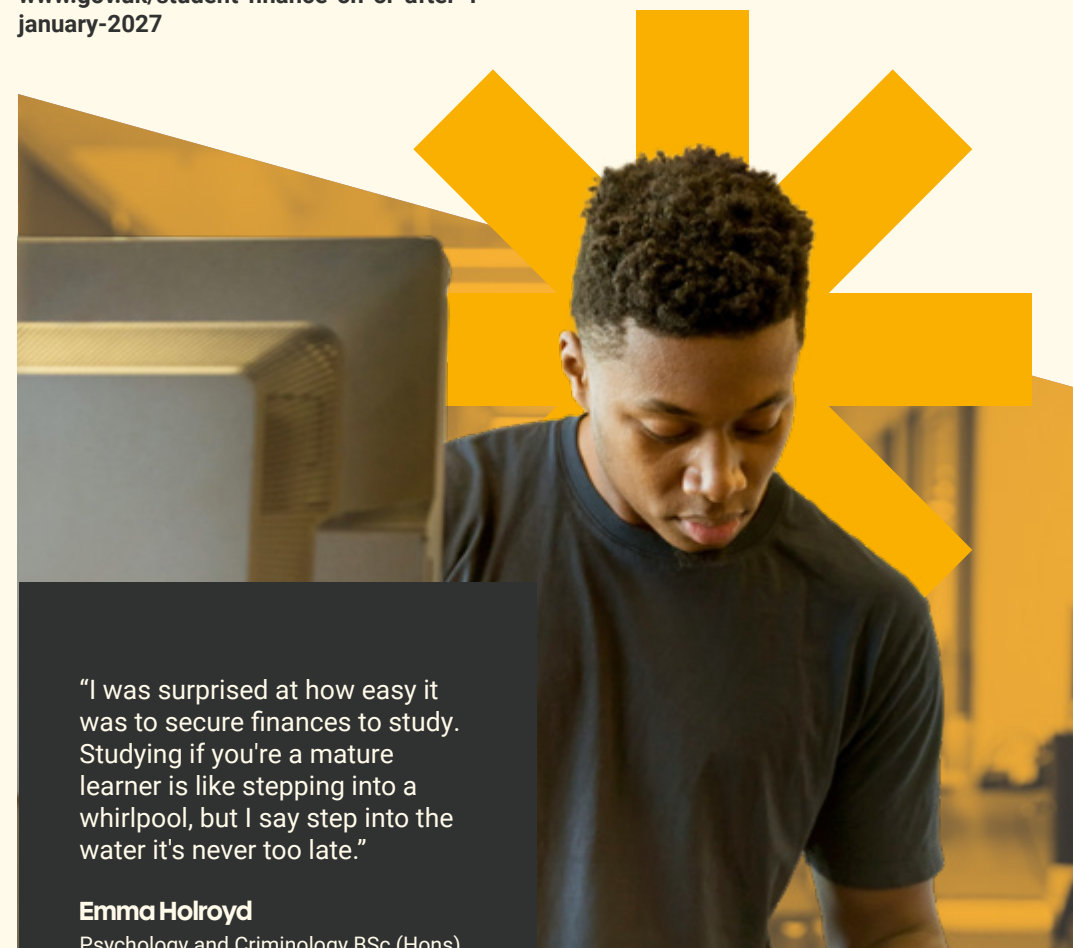
## Will there be other costs?

# Additional Information

## Can I get extra support while I'm studying?

Yes, the student support team is based on the third floor of the Southend Forum and deals with a range of issues including; disability support, study skills, careers advice and guidance, accommodation, funding issues, wellbeing and any other general concerns that may be impeding studies. This location is designed exclusively for HE students and allows the team to be in direct contact with students, lecturers and staff. All of the team regularly travel to other campuses and provide drop in or booked sessions as required. A number of staff members are trained in mental health first aid and we have a team of pastoral coaches and safeguarding officers who can provide confidential support and advice. They can refer students to trained counsellors and can also provide contact details for specialist support groups and organisations.

## Can I get careers advice and guidance?

Yes, our careers co-ordinators will provide you with impartial information, advice and guidance for all your career and employability needs.

The co-ordinators offer a friendly and professional service covering a range of topics including career planning, developing key graduate employability skills, CV writing, interview techniques, work experience, internship support, exploring progression routes and postgraduate study.

## Can I get help with academic skills and technology?

Yes, our advisors can support you in developing or refreshing the skills you need to manage your studies. Workshops, one-to-ones and drop in sessions take place throughout the year to ensure that you have all the tools you need to succeed.

## Is there financial advice available?

Yes, our adviser can discuss money matters with you and inform you of the financial support you may be eligible for from both Student Finance England and the university centre.

The advisor can support you with any applications and provide financial signposting services whilst you study.

# Disability Support

- Liaising with external providers on your behalf
- Sharing information with your academic team on your behalf

## Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA)

DSA is a non-repayable grant for students with a disability, funded by Student Finance England.

The purpose of the grant is to help students with the cost of any extra essential equipment or support they may need for their studies as a direct result of their disability.

Students are not required to contribute to these costs, and their household income is also not considered in their allocated budget.

The type of support students receive will depend on their disability and how this impacts them. Examples are:

- Specialist equipment and technology (e.g. laptop, recording device for note taking, audio reader software, dictation software, etc.)
- Specialist support (e.g. study skills tutoring, mentoring, BSL interpreter, etc.)
- Financial support towards printing costs
- Financial support towards travel

If you need additional support with your studies, it is important you apply for DSA as early as possible to ensure it is in place for the start of your studies.

## Reasonable adjustments

Disabled students can ask for adjustments that may support them to access the same education or services as their non-disabled peers. These are known as 'reasonable adjustments'. Examples are:

- Additional time to complete exams/assessments
- A priority lift pass
- Access to orthopaedic chairs in class
- Print-outs on coloured paper or online resources created with coloured backgrounds
- Alterations of assessment mode (e.g. essay to presentation)

If you need specific adjustments made to support your studies, it is important you speak to the Disability Support team as early as possible so that we can make formal recommendations for adjustments to support your studies. Contact us at:

## Diagnostic assessments and screenings

Here at UCSE we offer two different types of diagnostic assessment or screening to support students who may not have a current diagnosis but know they are struggling and need extra support. These are:

- Diagnostic assessments for Specific Learning Difficulties (Dyslexia and Dyspraxia)
- ADHD screenings

Diagnostic assessments provide a full diagnosis of Dyslexia, Dyspraxia or both. ADHD screenings cannot diagnose ADHD, but they enable us to develop a support plan and assist with getting a referral for diagnosis from a GP.

### Course Revalidation

Revalidation is the process through which an existing degree programme is reviewed and updated to ensure its content remains current, relevant and academically robust. This process may involve consultation with students, graduates, staff, industry professionals and representatives from the relevant awarding or validating body.

The timing and requirements for revalidation vary depending on the programme and the policies of the awarding or validating body. Where a course is undergoing revalidation for 2027 entry, any significant changes will be communicated to applicants before the start of their studies.

### Course Validation

Validation is the process of creating a new degree programme. The programme is created through consultation with industry experts and university representatives from across the Higher Education sector. This programme is currently being validated for commencement in the 2027 academic year.

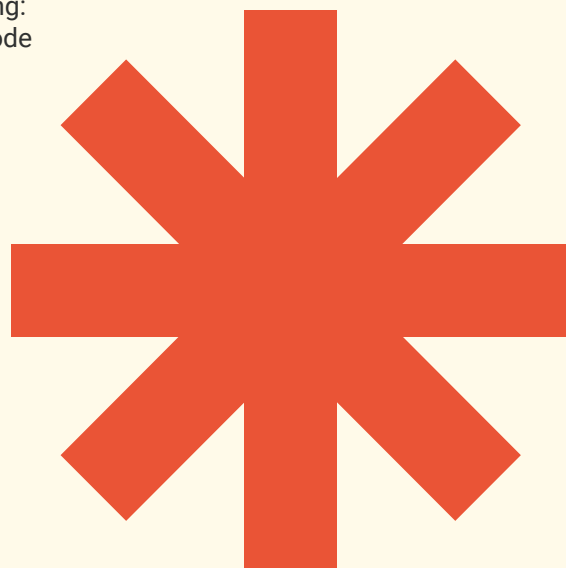
